




Recreation

Streator has 71 acres of city parks available for her residents. Central and Oakland Parks have tennis courts. A strong Little League and other baseball programs are carried out on several special diamonds. In addition the city operates Anderson Field, a 9 hole public golf course and a municipal swimming pool.

Area residents participate in the Community Orchestra, Community Band, and Community Players. In addition, the Streator Hobby Council



opens its membership to anyone interested in hobby activities. Annually, Streator hosts the Polish Picnic, Horse show, and special July 4th and Labor Day celebrations.

Many nationally known clubs and organizations have active chapters in Streator. Some of these maintain club rooms with dining, meeting, and recreational facilities.

For the outdoor enthusiast there is hunting for pheasant, rabbit, duck, and deer in the area as well as fishing, swimming, and boating.

There are two indoor and one outdoor movie theaters, a roller skating rink, and two bowling establishments with automatic pin setters.





Radio Station WLAX, FM, 3,000 watts, operates on a frequency of 97.7 KC and serves over one-half million persons.


Cable TV Service is provided for Streator residents by Sammons Communications, Inc.

PUBLIC UTILITIES

Streator is district headquarters for Commonwealth Edison Company, the supplier of electricity for the area through 8510 meters.

Telephone service in Streator is available through the General Telephone Company. The Streator District has 21,517 residential lines and 2,878 business and industrial lines and has 40,748 telephones installed in

the area.

Natural gas is provided through Northern Illinois Corp. It requires 50 miles of pipe and 7950 meters to serve Streator.

The water supply comes through the 7,695 meters of the Northern Illinois Water Co.




ST. MARY'S HOSPITAL

At the request of city officials, Hospital Sisters of the Third Order of St. Francis brought medical care to the Streatorland Community in 1887. Today the hospital founded by the Sisters occupies a modern 254-bed facility and continues to stand ready to serve area residents.

Physicians specializing in emergency medicine are on duty aroundthe-clock. Also available to handle critical life situations is a 7-bed cardiac, medical and surgical intensive care unit staffed by highly skilled nursing personnel and equipped with individual bedside cardiac monitors and an accompanying main console.

In the laboratory, staffed 24 hours a day, 350,000 tests are performed annually. Radiology department with its X-ray and fluoroscopic equipment is also a vital link in diagnosing, pinpointing and treating disease.




In addition, the department offers nuclear medicine and angiography procedures. Cobalt therapy is given for the treatment of cancer.

The hospital pharmacy utilizes a unit dose system in its drug distribution and the registered pharmacists who provide this service are available 24 hours a day.

St. Mary's Hospital is concerned about the whole person. Trained

pastoral care workers and the hospital chaplain, in cooperation with local ministers and priests, seek to bring aid and comfort to patients and their families. St. Mary's Social Service department serves as a bridge between hospital and community life. The department's staff members strive to assist patients in overcoming stresses which interfere with effective medical treatment.



Recovery Facilities, an Inservice Education Program and three dedicated groups of Volunteers. St. Mary's Hospital employs over 600 people and

supplies medical service annually for over 65,000 patient census days and over 35,000 out-patient visits.



EDUCATION


The Streator school system is preparing youngsters to meet their challenges of tomorrow. Teaching methods utilized in the elementary schools (public and parochial) and the high schools in the area are many times the deciding factor when families choose to locate here.

Tailored to guide each student to his full potential, the Streator schools offer special education for children in addition to regular and

college preparatory courses. Attesting to the success of the educational program is the fact that about eighty percent of the high school graduates attend training programs, vocational or technical, or colleges.

Interscholastic, intramural, and extra-curricular programs with diversified activities make learning a pleasant experience.




























Government for the people, by the people, and of the people.

Streator employs the commission form of city government led by the mayor and four commissioners.

The police department is comprised of 26 men, two meter maids and one clerk. The four police cars are linked with all other law departments by ISPERN, the new Illinois State Police Radio network.

The city administrators and the police department moved into the new municipal and jail complex, located at 204 S. Bloomington St. in

March, 1976.

Fire Protection is provided by a chief and 15 men. There are three pumpers, two regular and one reserve, one ladder truck and one emergency truck. The two ambulances operate on a fee per trip basis.

The Streator Emergency Service Disaster Agency Unit is comprised of trained volunteers to help police and firemen in emergency situations.















Each week the Streator Times-Press publishes a listing of area church services which is sponsored by local business and professional persons.






THE GLASS CONTAINER CAPITAL OF THE WORLD









INDUSTRY




